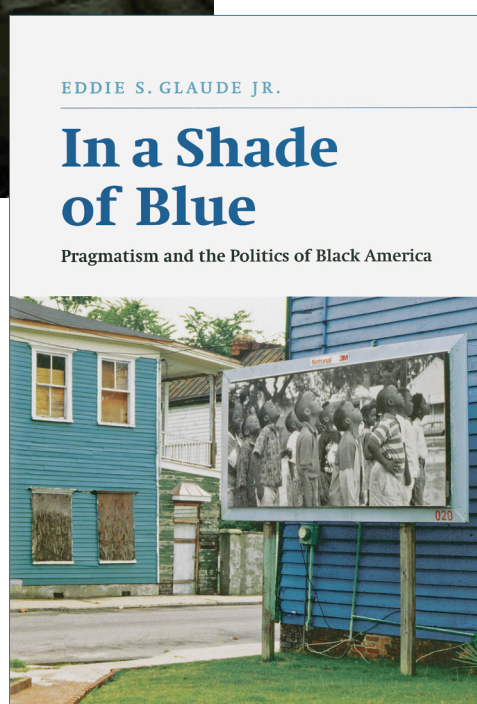

Professor Glaude is most recently the author of *In a Shade of Blue: Pragmatism and the Politics of Black America* (University of Chicago Press). He is also one of the authors and architects of the *Covenant With Black America*. He travels the country with Tavis Smiley discussing the CWBA, and is a regular voice on “The Tavis Smiley Show” on National Public Radio.

Glaude is also the author of *Exodus! Religion, Race, and Nation in Early 19th Century Black America* (University of Chicago Press) and the editor of *Is It Nation Time? Contemporary Essays on Black Power and Black Nationalism* (University of Chicago Press) and *African-American Religious Thought: An Anthology* (WJK; co-edited with Cornel West). He received the 2002 Modern Language Association William Sanders Scarborough Prize for his book *Exodus!*
