

From Black Muslim to Salafi: The Evolution of Islam in an American Prison

Drawing on his recent book, *Down in the Chapel: Religious Life in an American Prison* (FSG, 2013) Joshua Dubler explores the contested history of Muslim practice at Pennsylvania's Graterford Prison. Focusing in on the unflattering ways that Nation of Islam old heads and members of the emergent Salafi majority tend to impugn one another's beliefs and practices, Dubler invites us to think critically about the revealing frameworks through which religious prisoners are commonly configured.
